



A Growing Campaign

This year's cover dog Max was rescued from racing and now helps kids and senior citizens as a professional therapy dog. Another Florida dog named Birthday Toy was not so lucky. At three years of age, he was electrocuted while racing at the Sanford-Orlando Kennel Club. Oxbow Savage suffered a cracked skull and died during his final race at Tucson Greyhound Park. He was only two.

At GREYK USA, we want stories like this to be a thing of the past. Our goal is to end dog racing and make greyhounds "just dogs" again.

Before the 1919 creation of oval tracks and the patenting of the mechanical lure, commercial wagering on greyhounds did not exist. Then in the 1920's, gangsters like Al Capone began opening up illegal "flapper" tracks. Florida became the first state to legalize dog racing in 1931. Despite the well-meaning efforts of humane societies, there was simply not enough information to show that dog racing would cause great harm to its participants.

Now we have the records and the pictures and the experience to prove that greyhound racing is cruel and inhumane. With this new information, we have helped close 26 U.S. tracks to dog racing. The number of pups born into this industry is at an all-time low.



Sadly, countries such as England, Ireland and Australia imitated the American model and greyhounds have become "racing machines" abroad as well. Thanks to your support, GREY2K USA is now forming alliances to

stamp out this cruelty worldwide. Our first major campaign surrounds the Canidrome, a lone dog track on a Chinese peninsula. You can follow the efforts of our multi-national, multi-organizational campaign at grey2kusa.org/worldwide



Victories & Predictions

- VictoryLand dog track of Alabama was shut down in June!
- Arizona lawmakers passed our greyhound decoupling bill, paving the way for live dog racing to finally end at Tucson Greyhound Park. Stay tuned!
- The Irish government sided with the greyhounds and refused to allow Irish trainers to send their dogs to China.
- Mayor Boris Johnson stood up to the industry and refused to permit the reintroduction of dog racing to Walthamstow Stadium in London.
- The Florida greyhound decoupling bill will be refiled in the new legislative session. We are optimistic that this will be the beginning of a new life for greyhounds in the Sunshine State.
- New information will come out to show that dog racing must end in the U.K.
- The license for the Canidrome dog track on Macau will not be renewed and dog racing will end in China.


Below is a summary of our 2011 expenditures.
