A Year of Love

2016 saw key victories around the world, including a unanimous vote in May to prohibit dog racing in the state of **Arizona!**



In **Kansas**, we were able to defeat a dangerous attempt to reopen three long-closed dog tracks there. In **West Virginia**, the legislature again reduced subsidies to National Greyhound Association breeders. Plus, the last dog track in **Oregon**, Multnomah Greyhound Park, was demolished in June! Dog racing now remains legal and operational in just a handful of states.



Meanwhile, an August vote against dog racing in New South Wales, Australia will mean the closure of dozens of tracks Down Under. Argentina is also coming very close to

passing a preemption on dog racing and our friends in **New Zealand** are making a concerted effort to expose the cruelty of dog racing there for the first time. In Dublin, **Ireland**, four hundred animal advocates rallied for the greyhounds outside the doors of Parliament, the

biggest single protest ever for greyhounds worldwide. Meanwhile, the last dog track in **London**, at Wimbledon, will be holding its last race in just a few months!



Perhaps the biggest news is that the worst dog track in the world, **China's Canidrome**, is teetering after receiving an eviction notice from the Macau government. Facing financial losses of 82% over the last year, its days are numbered and our work to help place the dogs will soon begin.






On October 15, advocates from a dozen countries joined together for the first international conference on greyhound advocacy. Our Greyhounds Around the Globe gathering took place in Florida, the first jurisdiction in the world to legalize commercial dog racing.

The day started with the release by ABC
News of our video documenting the cruelty
of dog racing at nearby Palm Beach Kennel
Club. We exposed the violent collisions,
injuries and deaths that greyhounds suffer
at this facility. In fact, according to state
records, a dog dies every three days at a
Florida racetrack. This is something we are
determined to change.

Throughout the day, representatives from other racing countries, including Australia, China and Great Britain as well as adoption advocates from around the world, spoke of their efforts to help greyhounds. This historic day concluded with the release of a joint letter to the leaders of eight dog racing countries, asking them to shut down this heartless industry. Counting the Ways

As we grow, GREY2K USA continues to use resources efficiently. Below is a summary of our 2015 expenditures. You make our work possible!

- Programs: 83% of all expenditures were used directly for programs including legislative advocacy, ballot initiatives, legal research, and investigations into the cruelty and killing of greyhound racing.
- Development: 10% of expenditures were focused on the production of adoption information and educational materials for the general public, distribution of campaign updates to supporters, upgrades to our web site, and other member services.
- Management & General Expenses: 8% of expenditures paid for registration and reporting in racing states, legal and accounting support, and administrative costs for our Massachusetts headquarters.
- Total Annual Expenses: \$583,726.


